FOXY

Created as a shorter lasting alternative to LSD, Foxy is found in club scenes and social venues.

It is a synthetic tryptamine, a nonhallucinogenic chemical that some hallucinogens can be derived from.

DRUG I.D.

Looks: powder or liquid, most likely a red or purple tablet or capsule with an alien head or spider stamp. The powder inside comes in various colors.

Street Names: Foxy Methoxy, Dip Foxy, Yum Yum, Muffy

Methods of Use: Oral ingestion of pills, smoke or snort the powder

Actions: Stimulates energy and induces hallucinations, last 3-6 hours

Warning Signs: Panic attacks, paranoia, cardiac arrest

TRAGEDIES

Causing a loss of inhibitions, users have found themselves victims of date rape.

High dosages have led users to place themselves in extreme danger, and even commit suicide.

WAY_TO_GO

Dealers often replace Ecstasy with Foxy, and it makes it difficult for the user to be sure what they are receiving. Dealers do this to avoid the stiffer legal penalties of dealing Ecstasy. For this reason, Foxy is a scheduled controlled substance in the US, meaning it is illegal to possess or use.
