A highly-potent cocktail of several dangerous opioids including: heroin, fentanyl, carfentanil, and Pink/U-47700.

Gray Death was created in a failed attempt to combine the different types of highs created by multiple opioids. Instead, a deadly mixture is on the streets. Gray Death's strength and ingredients are unknown to users, making it a lethal combination that can kill in just one dose.

Looks: Looks like concrete mix, varies in consistency from a hard rock to a fine powder. Gray in color.

Street Names: Gray, Gray Death

Methods of Use: Snorted, Injected, Smoked, Swallowed

Actions: The combination of drugs is so potent, overdose is almost immediate. Any effects are mostly unknown.

Warning Signs: Immediate overdose symptoms.

TRAGEDIES

At least 46 deaths across the United States have been linked to the drug. More overdoses and deaths are likely, but testing is usually for only one ingredient, not multiple, so keeping track has been difficult. Police and medical experts are warning that this combination drug is a public safety issue.

WAY_TO_GO

Gray Death is a deadly combination of drugs that cause instant overdose. The drugs it contains are lethal on their own and when combined have none of the desired effects but all of the risk. Overdose reversal drugs like Naloxone could be ineffective or need upwards of ten or more doses. The fatal dose is smaller than the human eye can see.
