

2C-B

Originally developed for psychiatric treatment, 2C-B quickly became a recreational drug throughout Europe and the U.S.

It is often sold as Ecstasy, a similar substance, so users are unaware they are taking 2C-B. The purposely-mislabeled product comes in higher dosages and causes more problems for users.

DRUG_I.D.

Looks: Powder or capsule; pill that may have an icon stamped into it

Street Names: Bees, Eros, Nexus

Methods of Use: Oral ingestion or nasal inhalation; nasal inhalation is reported as very painful

Actions: Aphrodisiac which lasts for a few hours; effects come and go in waves, leaving user to think they need more when the effects are in a state of lull

Warning Signs: Extreme fear, nausea, visual and auditory over-stimulation

TRAGEDIES

2C-B is not always labeled correctly, and can be sold when the user is expecting something else.

This mislabeling has led to deaths in Europe and the U.S.

WAY_TO_GO

Popular in the rave subculture, 2C-B has become a dangerous substance on the streets. Since 1995, it has been illegal to produce, sell, or possess 2C-B in the U.S. There is a heavy prison sentence for breaking that law.
