KETAMINE

Ketamine is a "dissociative anesthetic." It is used mostly in animal surgery. People on ketamine look awake, but are actually cut off from reality.

Ketamine dealers may steal the drug or snuggle it into the country. People use it to have an "out of body" experience. If they are unlucky, they could be out of their body forever.

DRUG ID

Looks: Usually a white powder; sometimes clear liquid

Street Names: Ket, K, Special K, Vitamin K, cat tranquilizers, baby food, bumps, K-land, the K-hole

Methods of Use: Usually sniffed; sometimes swallowed or injected

Actions: Ketamine blocks pain and causes memory loss. Breathing and heart rate are altered. Most effects last about one hour, but some continue up to 48 hours.

Warning Signs: Outward signs vary a lot. Some people have sudden excess energy. Others become weak and motionless. Users may stumble, slur their speech, and seem confused.

2.5% of 12th graders surveyed in 2001 had tried ketamine at least once in the previous year.
