


METHAMPHETAMINE

Methamphetamine makes addicts out of users with terrible speed. It is easy to make, using chemicals that are cheap to buy. It wrecks whole communities. It puts cops and firefighters in danger. It even hurts the environment! "Poor Man's Cocaine" is an awful, costly problem.



DRUG ID

Looks: Either a white powder or chunks that look like glass or rock salt.

Street Names: Meth, speed, chalk, crank, ice, crystal, go-fast, and glass

Methods of Use: Sniffed, smoked, injected, or swallowed

Actions: Methamphetamine gives users an intense rush of energy. Users can't stop moving. They feel jittery and anxious for 6-24 hours. Then they crash and feel an overpowering craving to use meth again. The cycle of using and crashing is called a "run." A run ends when the user collapses.

Warning Signs: Sores on skin; tooth grinding and bad teeth; heavy sweating and body odor



THE NUMBERS

14,923 emergency room visits due to methamphetamine abuse last year.

11.0% of 12th graders used at least once; 2.6% use it regularly.
