
Sheriff's deputies are friends who help keep our cities and towns safe. Sheriff's deputies help with emergencies, solve crimes, and protect people.



If you are ever in trouble, a sheriff's deputy can help!




CROSSING THE STREET



Helping you cross the street safely is just one of many ways that sheriff's deputies protect you!




CRIME PREVENTION

Sheriff's deputies want you to always remember to lock your bike when you leave it, even if you are only going to be away for a minute.


IF YOU GET LOST ...

THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE




The sheriff's office is a safe place where you can go to find help if you're ever lost or in trouble.



SHERIFF VEHICLES



SHERIFF'S DOGS


Sheriff's dogs are your friends too! Dogs help sheriff's deputies by searching for missing people and tracking suspects.



Stay safe around sheriff's dogs! Never approach a sheriff's dog without first asking permission from their handler.




CALLING 9-1-1

A deputy will come to help you.


GUN SAFETY



If you see a gun - **NEVER PICK IT UP!** Leave it alone. Turn around and tell an adult or call the sheriff's office.




STRANGER DANGER

DRUG REFUSAL




Sheriff's deputies want you to know that drugs are bad for you. If you see anyone, even other kids, taking drugs, smoking, or drinking alcohol, walk away!
