social HOSTING

Social Hosting is providing and/or serving alcoholic beverages to people who are under the minimum drinking age of 21. It may take place during parties or other gatherings and it refers to **any adult** who **provides alcohol to teenagers.**

WHAT'S THE BIG DEAL?

Giving alcohol to teenagers sends the message that it's okay to break the law. Even though some parents and other adults believe they are providing a "safe" environment where teens can drink, the truth is there's no such thing as a "safe" environment when underage drinking is involved. Underage drinkers can act in unpredictable ways – leaving you liable for damage or injuries that may occur.



GREAT GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS:

WHEN HOSTING



- Avoid sending mass invitations and **limit** the number of **guests**.
- Let all guests know up front that the use of alcohol, tobacco, or drugs will not be tolerated.

CONSEQUENCES OF SOCIAL HOSTING



• Prosecution resulting in jail time, fines, or both.

- Being held civilly liable for medical bills or property damage.
- An increase in homeowner's insurance rates.
- Being responsible for the events that led to another's injury or death.

THE DANGERS OF UNDERAGE DRINKING





Underage drinkers are at a higher risk for:

- Impaired brain and physical development.
- Alcohol or substance abuse issues later in life.
- Contracting sexually transmitted infections.

• If a **teen** shows up **drunk** or brings alcohol, **call** his or her parents at once.

WHEN YOUR CHILDREN ARE ATTENDING A PARTY





- Insist that your teen checks in with you regularly.
- Verify that a responsible adult is supervising the party and that no alcohol will be served.
- Caution them about riding with drivers who have been drinking or using drugs.
- Set a **firm curfew** as well as serious **consequences** for breaking it.

Help Teens Become

• Dying from alcohol poisoning.

WHEN YOU ARE OUT OF TOWN

- Ask a responsible adult or local law enforcement to keep an eye on the house while you're away.
 - Establish **a strict "No Party" policy** while you are gone.

OTHER HELPFUL TIPS

- - Get to **know** your **teen's friends** and their **parents**.
 - Give your teen and their friends plenty of opportunities for fun, alcohol-free activities.
 - Make sure your teen knows how underage drinking can affect his or her future.
